"founded for the purpose of reconciling man to God and to fellow man, sharing God's concern for social justice and for the liberation of the less favored groups of people especially women, youth and children from every kind of oppression."

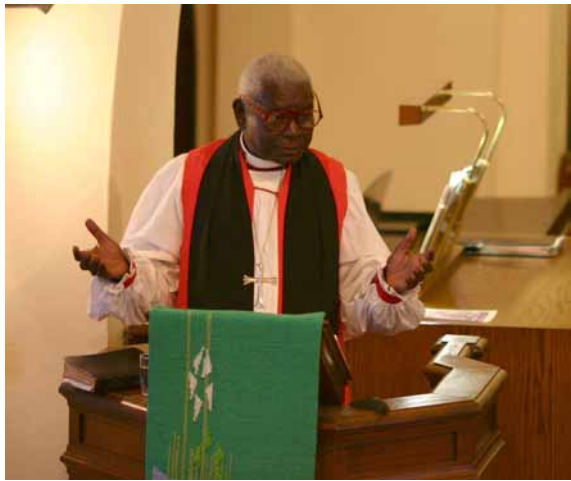
AFINNET strives to empower individuals within communities and households who can then act as catalysts to fight problems of illiteracy, poverty and diseases.

CONFIRMATION, RECEPTION, REAFFIRMATION

On Sunday, March 7, at the 10:30 a.m. service, our diocesan bishop (the Right Reverend James L. Jelinek) will be here to offer the service of confirmation, reception and reaffirmation.

Confirmation – for those who have never been confirmed in any denomination.

Reception – for those previously confirmed and who wish to become a member of the Episcopal Church.

Persons presented for reception are those who have been baptized with water in the name of the Trinity, have previously made a mature public affirmation of faith in any other Christian Communion (either at their Baptism or on a separate occasion), and now desire to live their faith within the fellowship of the Episcopal Church.

Reaffirmation – for those already confirmed, but who wish to make a public reaffirmation of their confirmation vows.

We make a public profession of faith before the Bishop because that office of ministry symbolizes that as Christians we are a part of God's universal Church in all times and places and not only of St. John's. There is no stronger way of reaffirming your baptismal vow to "continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of the bread, and in the prayers" than by making a public profession of faith at a celebration of the Eucharist before a bishop, who is a successor to the apostles. If as an adult, you would like to receive the sacrament of confirmation, reception or reaffirmation, please speak with Father Mark or call the church office at 651-429-5351.

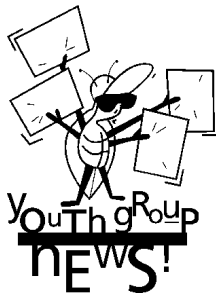
ST. JOHN'S MEN'S GROUP

More than any other section of the gospels, the stories of Jesus' arrest, trial, condemnation, execution, and burial have captured the attention and imagination of dramatists (passion plays), artists, musicians, and moviemakers (Mel Gibson's *The Passion*). The passion narratives are the centerpieces of the most sacred time in the church year, Lent and Holy Week. They contain the keys to understanding the Christian hope of justification, redemption and salvation for all. The stories in each of the four gospels do not, however, offer identical pictures of Jesus' trial and execution. In this series, we will explore these stories, based on Father Raymond E. Brown's commentary, *The Death of the Messiah. From Gethsemane to the Grave*.

DOLLARS AND CHURCH

We are getting off to a good start. Total income receipts were 37,000 compared to a budget of \$29,000. Caution is in order, however, as last year our January receipts were \$36,000. A real figure for excitement would be if we collected a substantial portion of the unpaid pledges from 2003. The potential for that is \$16,000. We actually budgeted that we would pick up \$1,000 of it and we did collect \$1,100 in January. Anything

more is money we can make available for programs in 2004.

My call for volunteers for the Finance Committee has been heard. I find that phenomenal! Thank you. The Finance Committee will resume regular meetings soon after April 15.

It is a comfort knowing that we don't have to expend any energy this year in negotiating a reduction in our diocesan giving. Perhaps we can even get started earlier in our committee audit process. I am also always interested in hearing from any of you about any thoughts or concerns you may have about the finances of our parish.
